All calls placed to 9-1-1, both cellular and landline, go directly to the Montgomery County Emergency Dispatch Services. To request police, fire, or EMS, dial 9-1-1. For non-emergency inquiries, please dial **610-649-1000**.

## Conduct, Performance, Recruitment

To preserve integrity and accountability necessary to maintain public respect for the police department, each and every complaint of poor service by police officers is thoroughly investigated.

Citizens are encouraged to assist the Department by reporting all compliments or poor service to the Staff and Inspections Unit on weekdays between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. You may report the incident in person or by phone and the report can be anonymous.

During weekend and evening hours, you may contact the Communications Center at 610-649-1000. When your report is brought to the attention of the Staff and Inspections Unit, you will be interviewed and the matter will be completely documented. Upon completion of the investigation, you will be notified in writing of the outcome.

The Police Department welcomes compliments. If you are impressed by an officer's professional demeanor, prompt response to a particular incident, or simply his or her courteousness, you are encouraged to mail or e-mail a brief note to the attention of the Superintendent of Police who will ensure that the officer receives a copy of your letter.
